You can also experience Hocking Hills' sustainable culture at Judy and Mike Hard's Wind Chime Shop. While they feature Ohio's largest collection of wind chimes, the real draw is the candle-making experience. Choose from an array of unusual scents, some of which include Cilantro, Santa's Pipe and Bacon, as well as standard floral and dessert smells. You'll make you're own candle using aromatic essential oils and local wax. Moreover, at the nearby Scenic Way gift shop and art glass studio showcases hand-blown glass creations by owner Audrey Martin. Audrey also displays and sells the work of local artists, with pieces ranging from clay to jewelry to metal.

Quirky Offerings


